Library Services Platform Project

Fulfilling a Need

Until full implementation of the new library system, California's Community College libraries are operating on no fewer than nine different platforms.

- Many of these are legacy systems that are no longer adequate in the evolving digital information environment.
- Many cannot be used with smartphones and other mobile devices.

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Cost-savings + More Equitable Technology

These mostly antiquated individual platforms are costing the CCC system \$5.25 million/year and giving our students at Lassen College far fewer resources than our students at Pasadena City College.

- Better technology, project administration, shared resources and other systemwide benefits will cost \$4 million/year.
- Over the next five years — that will save the system \$9.25 million

Library Services Platform Project

Project Overview

- A CCCCCO/CCCTC project to implement a single cloud-based Library Services Platform (LSP) to replace the various integrated library systems now used in the 110 participating libraries.
- Procurement process identified Ex Libris Alma and Primo products as LSP platform for CCCs

Library Services Platform Project

Project Overview

- 110 colleges opted into the project, making this the vendor's largest single-phase implementation
- The implementation phase for all participating libraries began in February 2019 with all 110 participating colleges going live on the system in December 2019.

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What IS is a Library Services Platform?

- Mission-critical software supporting library resource use:
 - Student side: search, check-outs, overdues, interlibrary loans, reserves, etc.
 - Staff side: patron records acquisitions, materials processing, licensing, electronic resource management, cataloging, inventory, analytics, interlibrary loans, reserves, etc.

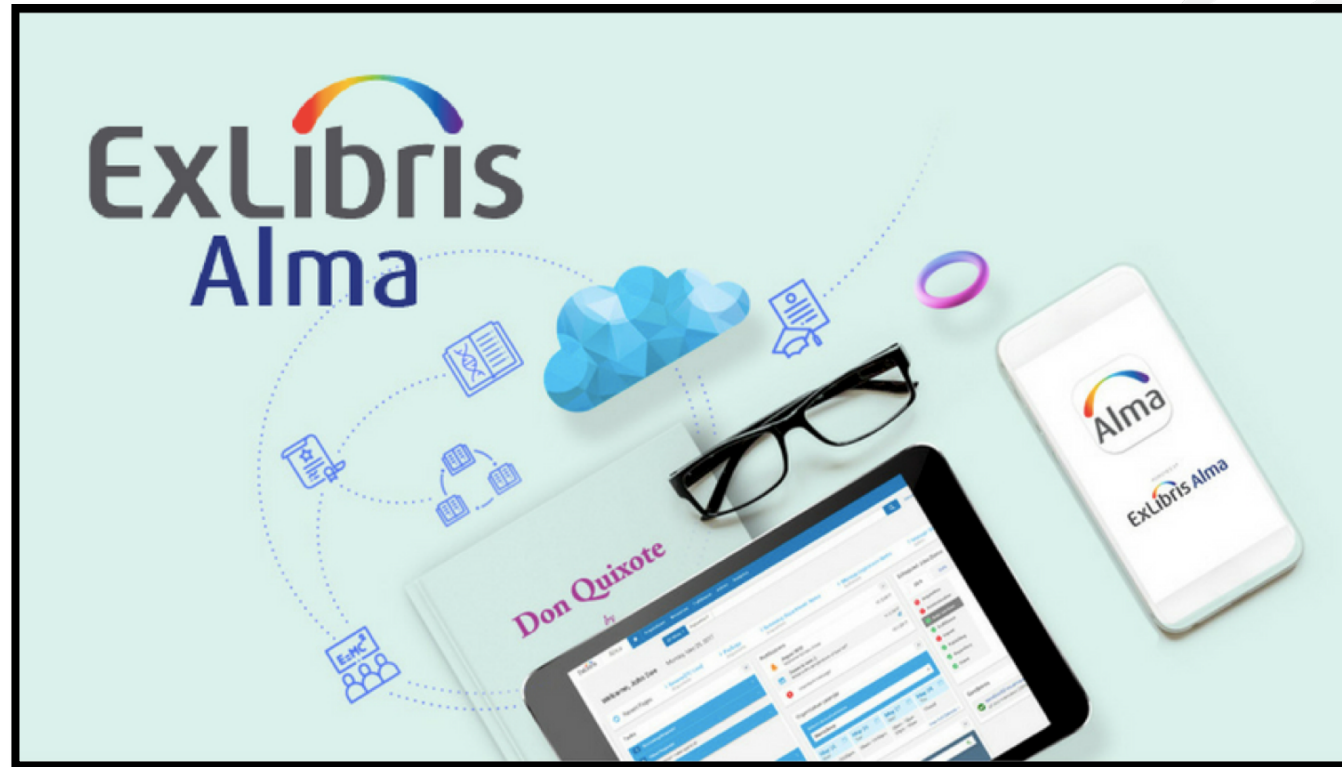
Library Services Platform Project

What IS is a Library Services Platform?

- Cloud-based
- System updates are vendor managed
- Shared “Network Zone”
- Established pathways for physical and electronic resource sharing
- Integrated system supporting work of library staff AND student use
- Designed with electronic resources in mind

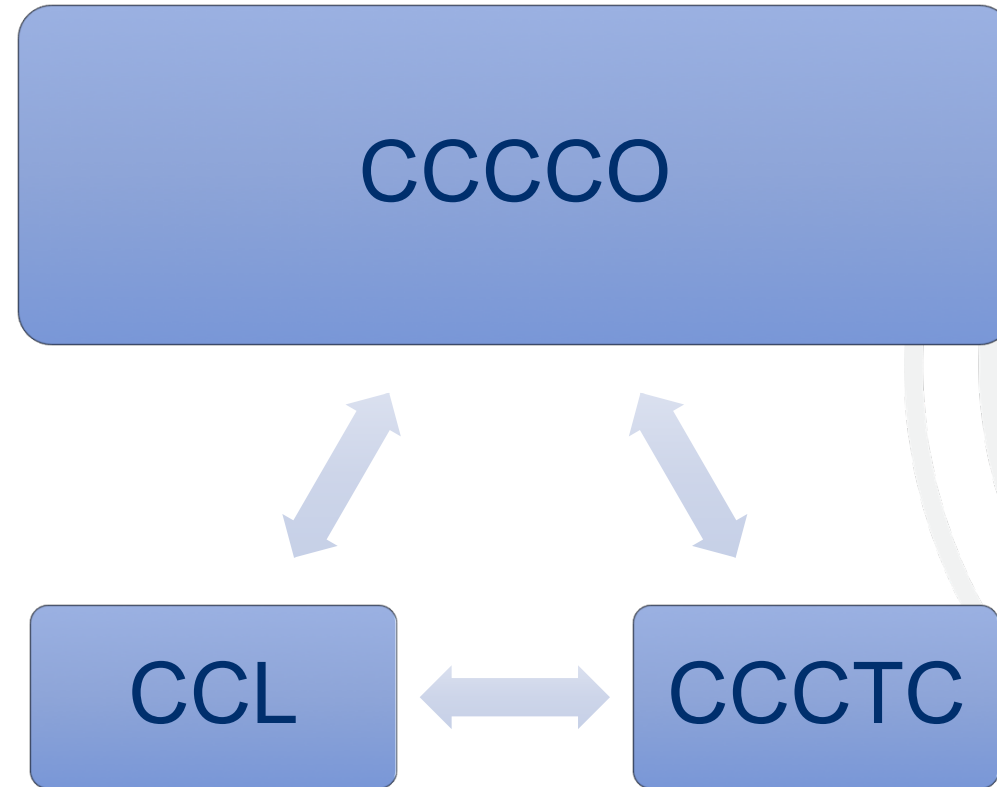

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Planning for Success— Vanguard Phase

- True representation of diverse CCC system in order to adequately prepare for systemwide migration issues
- Added five additional Vanguard colleges to increase diversity in pilot experience
- Selection criteria (FTEs, location, staffing, etc.) appropriately served in forming a Vanguard cohort that represented the diverse colleges across the CCC system.

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Planning for Success— Communication

Keeping all participants informed and confident in their understanding of participation requirements

- Partnered with CCL and other stakeholders to maintain transparency of project activities
- Developed a strong communication plan utilizing a variety channels and tools

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Planning for Success - Vanguard Outcomes

The Vanguard phase proved to be crucial in determining change management requirements to be applied to the full implementation phase in order to achieve a successful systemwide migration.
