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# Purpose

## **Outcomes – Course Design**

- Faculty develop a course that closely adheres to the OEI Rubric.
- Accessibility & equity is the foundation of course content.
- Faculty are confident in their abilities to use some of the more advanced tools of Canvas, reducing their need for technical support.

#### **Outcomes – Substantive Interaction**

- Courses are rich with student-to-student & faculty-to-student interaction.
- Faculty are experts at various means for student communication including tools built into Canvas, Zoom, Notebowl and Flipgrid.
- Faculty can clearly state their standards for communication and talk freely about various means and degrees of interaction in their courses.

### **Outcomes – Local POCR Foundation**

- Faculty have opportunities to view colleague courses.
- Faculty have a deep enough knowledge to comment and give suggestions on course design and alternative ideas.
- Faculty provide a foundation for building a local POCR process due to their in-depth knowledge of the CVC-OEI Course Design Rubric.

- Application Process
- Content spread over 6 months.
- Participating faculty receive 3PGA units + fees paid for OTC.
- Faculty are expected to keep up with course work & attend one two-hour workshop monthly.
