## Why a Distance Education Plan?

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- ☐ Provides a Clear and Measurable Goal of the College on Accessibility
- ☐ Brings Accessibility into Focus
- ☐ Allows for Formal Buy-In From Administration, Faculty and Staff
- ☐ Sets College Standard in Accessibility
- ☐ Allows Long-Term Planning in Accessibility (Financially and in Areas Relating to Resources and Training) and Continuous Improvement
- ☐ Gives Faculty, Staff and Administrators a Sense of Purpose and Goal to Reach in Accessibility
- ☐ Documentation for Potential Accessibility Auditing



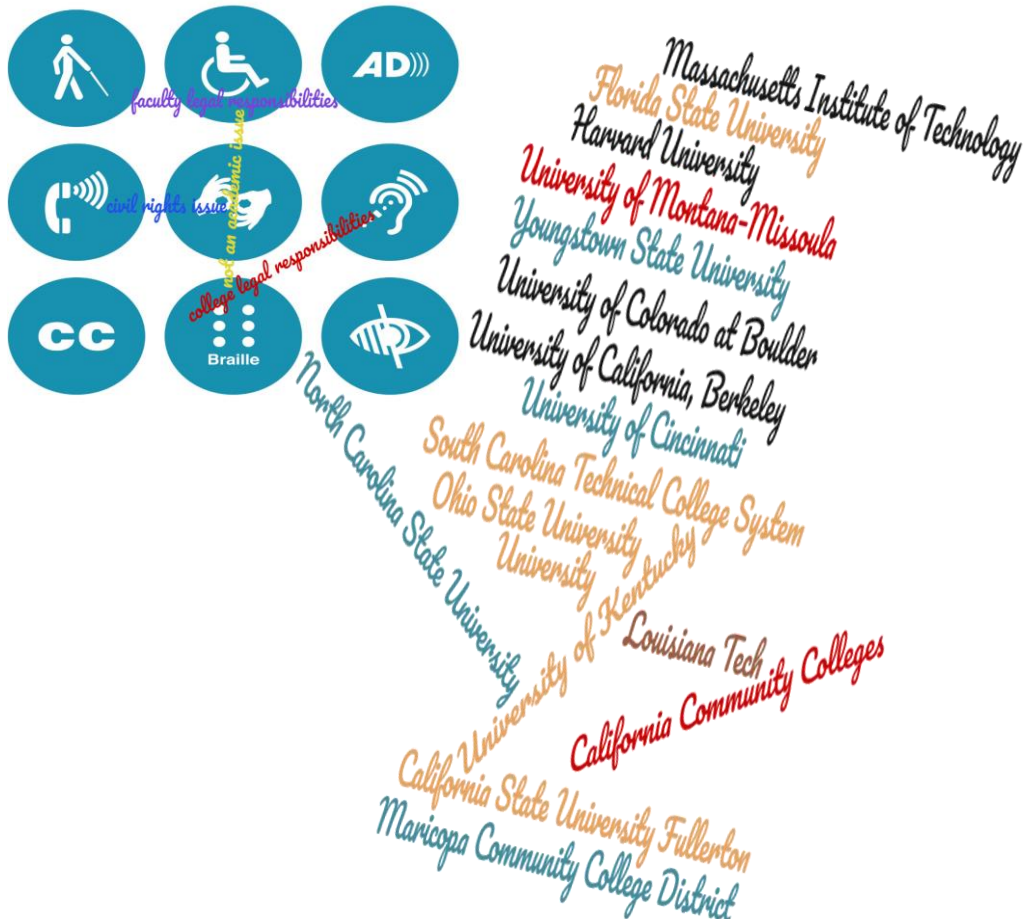
## Definitions of “Accessible” by Office of Civil Rights and the U.S. Department of Education

“Accessible” means a person with a disability is afforded the opportunity to acquire the same information, engage in the same interactions, & enjoy the same services as a person without a disability in an equally effective & equally integrated manner, with substantially equivalent ease of use. The person with a disability must be able to obtain the information as fully, equally & independently as a person without a disability.





## College Legal Obligation to Accessibility in Online Courses



- Americans with Disabilities Act (42 U.S.C. § 12100 et seq.)
- Section 508 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 as amended (29 U.S.C. § 749d)
- Title 5 Regulation on Distance Education (T§ 55206) - distance education course sections must meet the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (42 U.S.C. § 12100 et seq.) and section 508 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, (29 U.S.C. § 749d)



# Who's Responsible for Accessibility of Online Courses?

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## Instructor Responsibilities

- Creates Clear Navigation
- Alternative Text Writes Descriptions for Images
- Uses Accessible Documents
- Uses Closed Captioning
- Writes Description of Math and Science Equations/Formulas
- Uses Accessible Software and Web applications
- Provides DSPS with Course Materials for Accommodation Purposes

## Distance Education Responsibilities

- Provides media captioning for online courses upon request
- Offers accessibility training
- Provides accessibility resources and support
- Develops and maintains how-to video tutorials of accessibility tools
- Supports Accessibility Plan for Distance Education
- Reviews Course Materials for Accessibility Upon Request
- Provides Accessibility Tool Checkers to Faculty and Staff for Online Courses

## DSPS Responsibilities

- Increases Awareness of Disability Experience and Works with Staff and Faculty to Reduce Barriers
- Determines Student Eligibility for Accommodation
- Provides Alternative Format of Course Materials and Documents
- Supplies students with an accessible
- Provides Auxiliary Aids and Services





# Key Aspect of College Approach to DE Accessibility Plan

- Collaboration Between Faculty (Pedagogy and Technology Committee) and Distance Education Department
- Measurable Outcome
- Actionable Activities
- Leadership and Responsibilities
- Timeline
- Buy-in from Academic Senate
- Not Part of Faculty Evaluation
- Annual Evaluation of Plan





## College's DE Accessibility Plan and Its Outcome: Scripts and DSPS

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Accessibility Outcome	Action to Ensure Outcome	Who Responsible	Deadline
College Canvas scripts are accessible.	Offer updated accessible HTML and CSS training to Canvas administrators.	Distance Education Department	By end of Fall 2018
Inform faculty of the assistive technology tools available for students requiring accommodation in the College DSPS High Tech Center.	Provide faculty informational opportunities such as lunch and learns, video, or newsletter passages to inform them of the various accommodation tools for students available in the DSPS High Tech Center.	ACCESS Department	By end of Spring 2019





## College's DE Accessibility Plan and Its Outcome: Training

Accessibility Outcome	Action to Ensure Outcome	Who Responsible	Deadline
Train faculty how to make their courses accessible to students with disabilities.	Offer accessibility training (e.g. UDOIT, WAVE, PowerPoint, Word Document, PDF and Canvas pages) to faculty.	Distance Education Department	50% of faculty are trained by end of Spring 2019
			75% of faculty are trained by end of Fall 2019
			100% of faculty are trained by end of Spring 2020



## College's DE Accessibility Plan and Its Outcome: POCR

Accessibility Outcome		Action to Ensure Outcome	Who Responsible	Deadline
All online course materials are accessible to students with disabilities.  Faculty can choose option one or two to make their online course sections compliant.	Option 1	Faculty courses approved through the OEI POCR Process (CC POCR Team and/or OEI POCR Review)	Individual faculty member, OEI POCR Team, CC POCR Team (if used), and Distance Education Department	50% of all online course sections are accessible by end of Summer 2019
				75% of all online course sections are accessible by end of Spring 2020
	Option 2	Self-evaluation accessibility checklist signed by individual faculty.	Individual faculty, and Distance Education Department	100% of all online course sections are accessible by end of Fall 2020

**The Academic Senate-approved Resolution** to Apply to the OEI Exchange states that “the Cerro Coso Community College Academic Senate affirms a commitment to culturally responsive teaching, accessibility, and open educational resources, if applicable, in the design of online courses.”

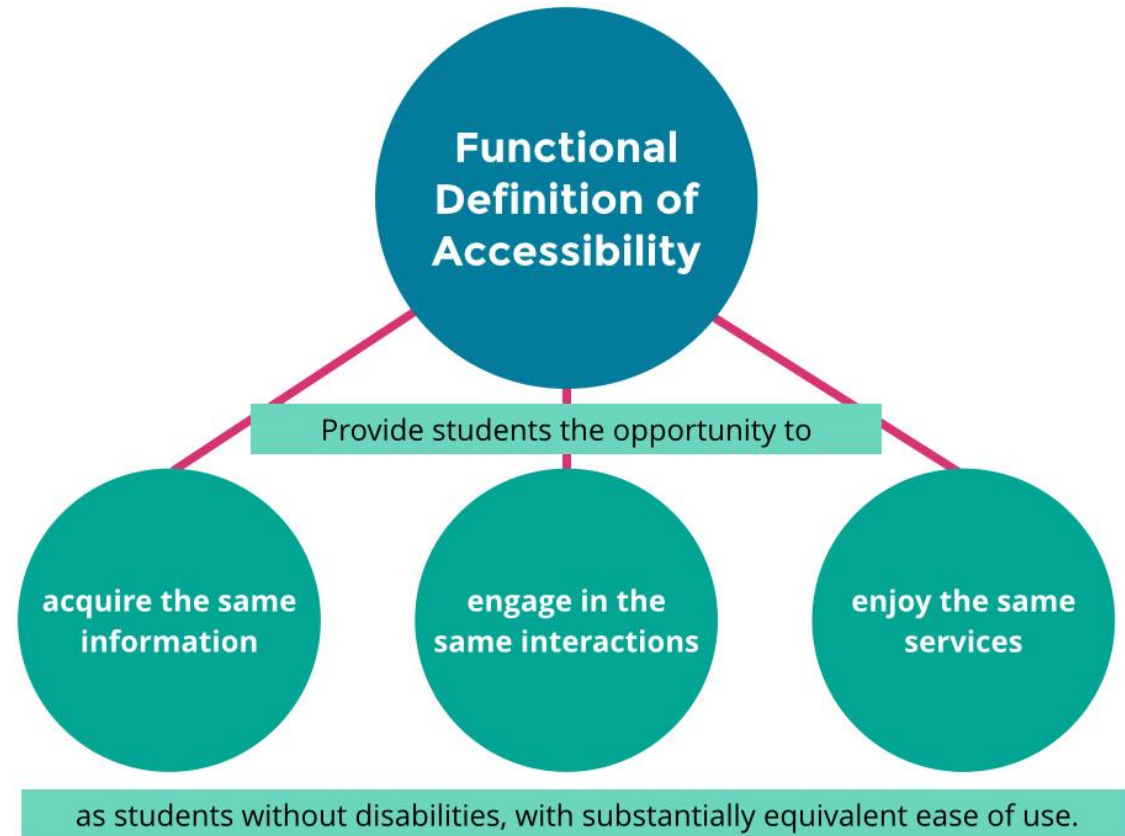
