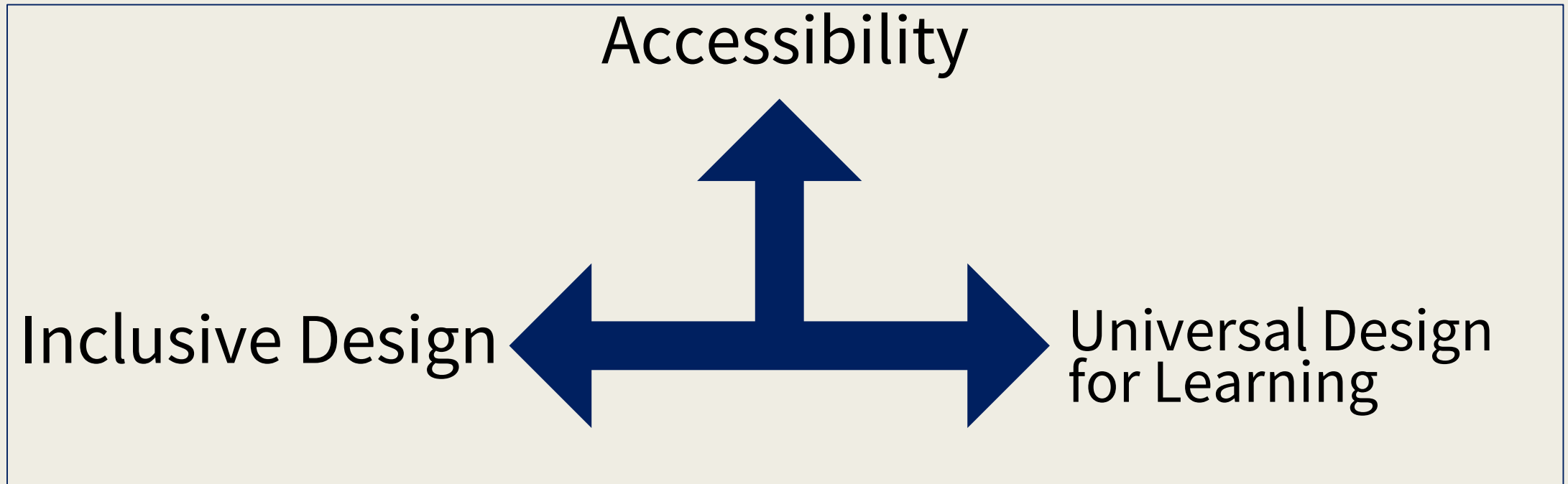

Why Accessibility?



- Inclusivity
- Avoid Reactive Accessibility (Accommodating)
 - *When we only accommodate it's like constantly building individual ladders to climb over the wall*
- Students never should have to disclose
- Practice Proactive Inclusion

Universal Design for Learning (UDL)

- A teaching and learning framework
- Diverse learners
- Improves and optimizes teaching and learning for all
- How accessible content fosters UDL
 - *Makes learning effective and usable for all*



What Needs to Be Accessible



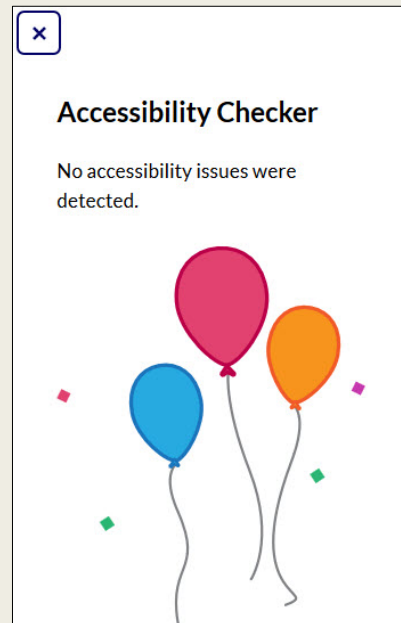
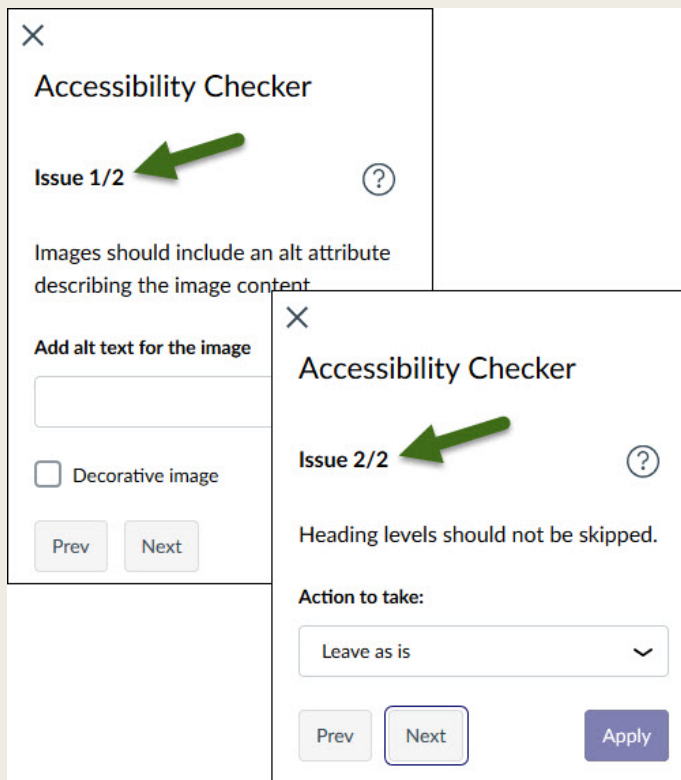
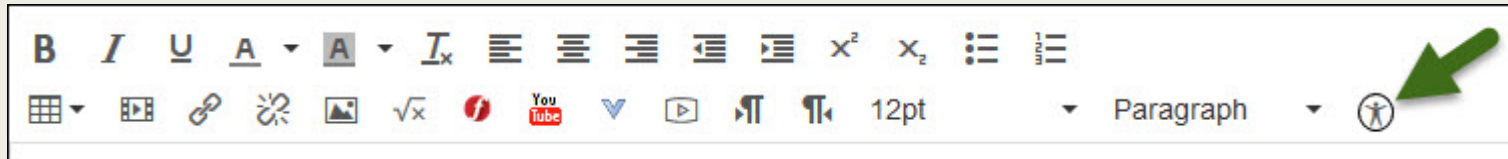
- Everything on the Internet
- Across the board, we can make content more accessible through consistent use of:
 - *a logical heading structure,*
 - *providing meaningful alt text,*
 - *properly labeling links,*
 - *captioning videos, and*
 - *adapting our writing style to reach the widest audience possible.*

Canvas Check Accessibility



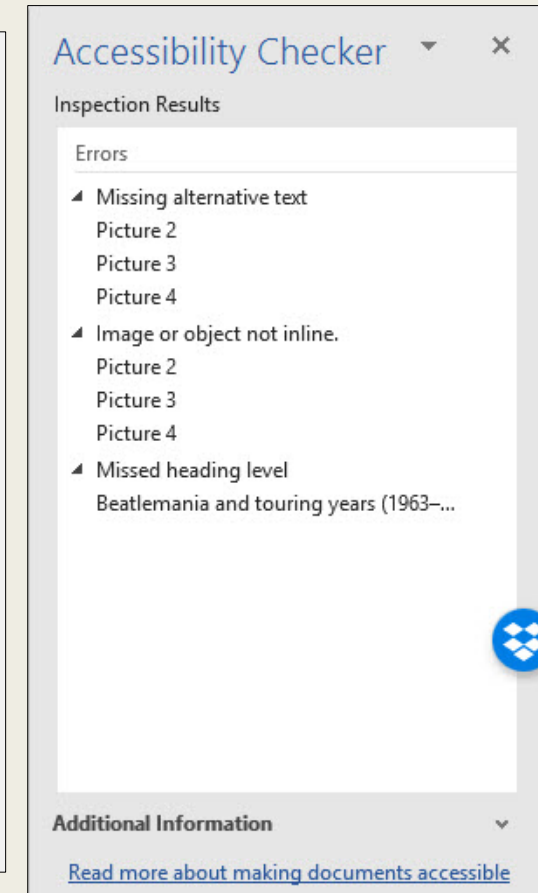
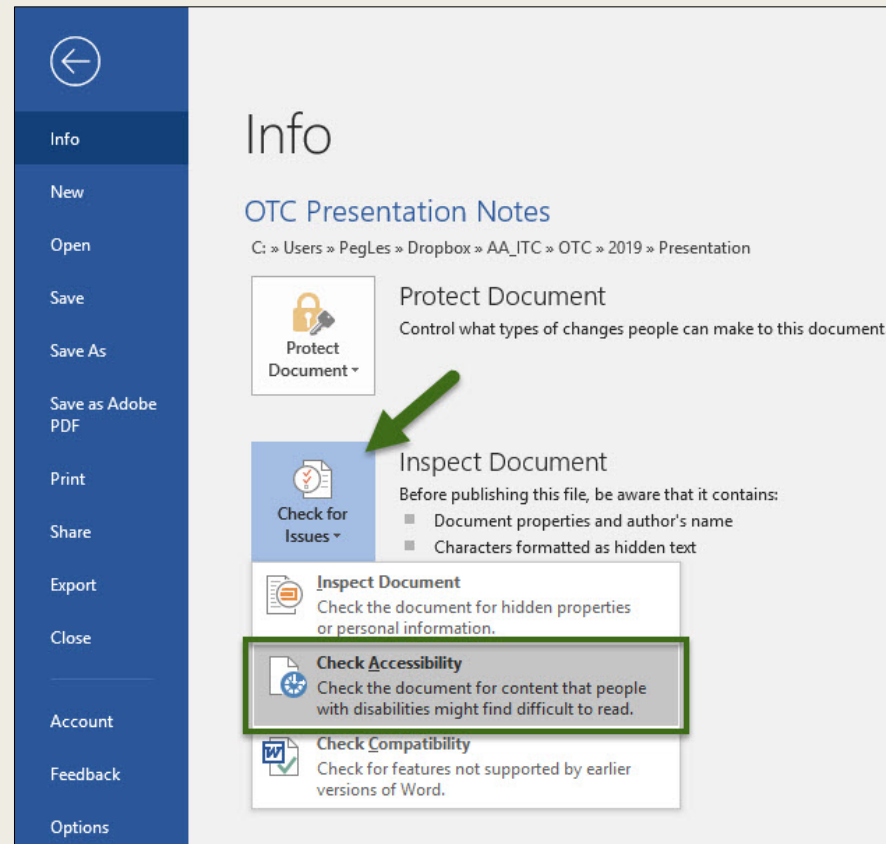
- Located in the Rich Content Editor
 - Checks common accessibility errors
 - Verifies numerous accessibility standards

MS Office Accessibility Checker

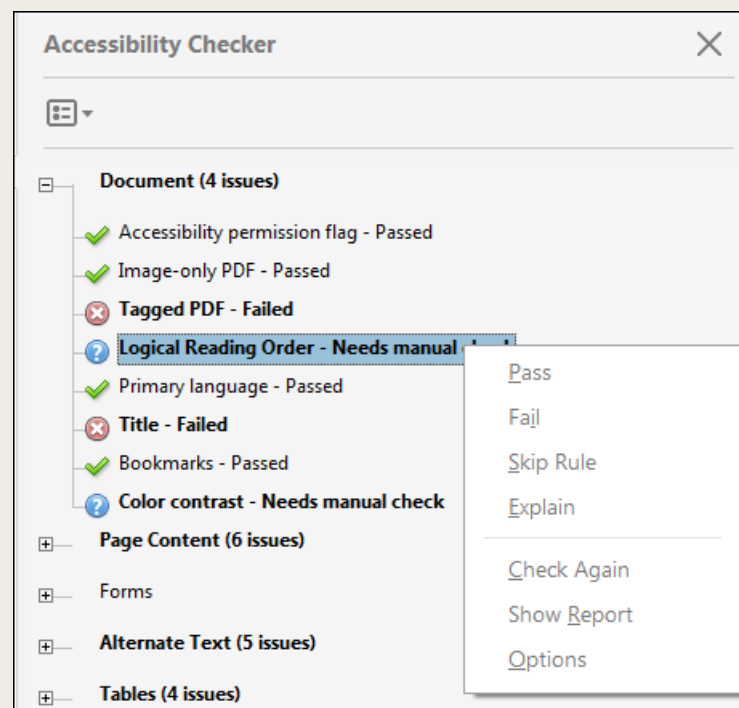
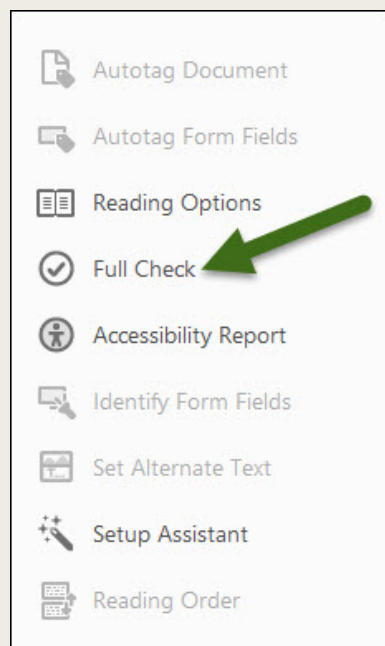
- MS Office is free for students and instructors:

- Drawbacks

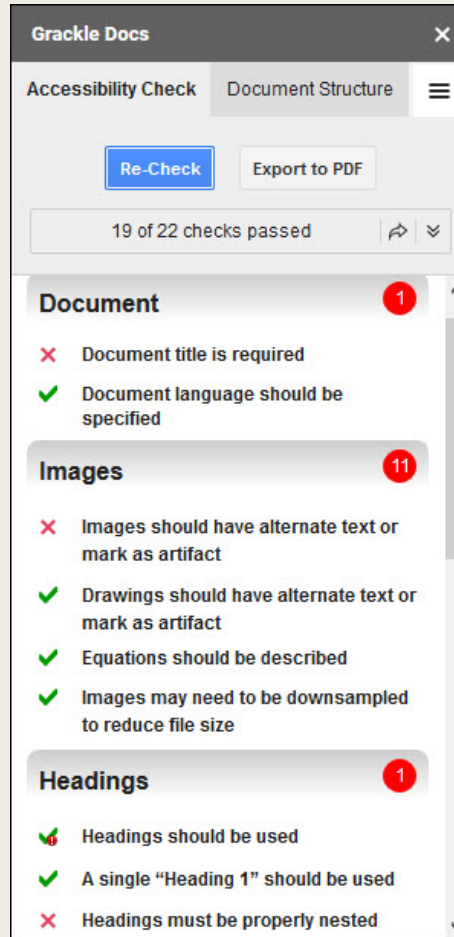
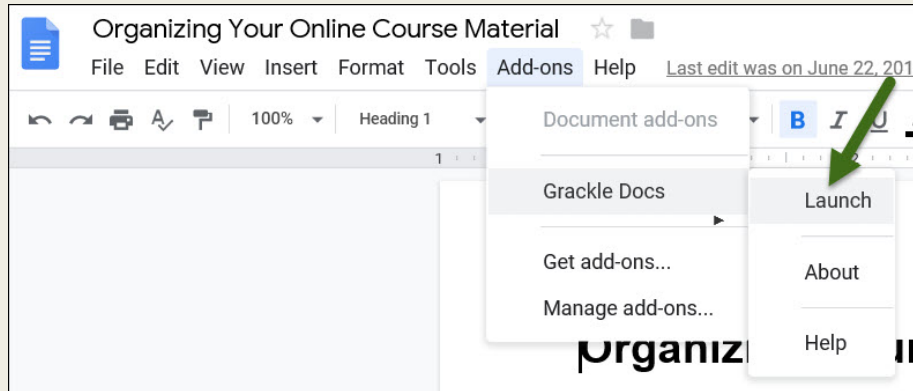


Adobe Acrobat Accessibility Checker



- Use Adobe Acrobat Pro
- Great for checking the accessibility status
- More complex to repair PDFs

Grackle for Google Docs



- Free to individuals through Add-ons
- Makes output from Google documents accessible
- Generates and entirely accessible PDF for exporting
